See also *Window to the World Communications, Inc.*, 372 NLRB No. 3, slip op. at 2 n.5 (2022); *Starbucks Corp.*, 371 NLRB No. 154, slip op. at 7 (2022) (Members Kaplan and Ring, dissenting). Here, the Regional Director had to halt and reschedule the original mail-ballot election because a substantial number of the voters' ballots were not being delivered to the Board's existing San Diego Resident Office as addressed. That Resident Office was to be relocated the day after the scheduled ballot count, and the impending move scrambled the handling of that office's mail. It came to light that some ballots were being returned to voters as undeliverable, being preemptively forwarded to the new location, or even being diverted to and opened at a dead-mail facility in Atlanta, Georgia.
